DuPage County has seen a 5% increase in drug overdose deaths in 2021.

While opioid-related overdose deaths have decreased, we have seen an increase in deaths involving stimulants and a multitude of other drugs.

The risk of fentanyl contaminated drugs still remains a threat to the public and now includes stimulants such as cocaine.

The DuPage Narcan Program

(DNP) was implemented in 2014 to save lives by reversing the effects of an opioid overdose. While the program initially focused on training first responders to recognize and respond to an opioid overdose with naloxone, the DNP has continued to expand by offering training and naloxone to various organizations and community members.

Training

Between 2014-2021, 10,333 individuals were trained through the DNP. In 2017, trainings expanded beyond law enforcement to community members, or bystanders, recognizing that families or other individuals are often the first at the scene of an overdose.

DNP Partnerships

Achieving the mission of saving lives is made possible through a variety of partner organizations that participate in the DNP.

The DNP has grown from primarily law enforcement participation to partnerships with 113 organizations across several sectors.






Opioid Reversals By Age




Opioid Reversals By Ethnicity
